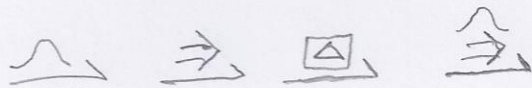


HAPPEN



The "hap" in "happen" means "chance". Therefore my id for "happen" \curvearrowright (\wedge chance, bell curve) and \rightarrow "to," or, as an indicator, "go by" (\sqcup vehicle). BUT often with the word "happen" we mean the opposite of "chance" - the mechanically necessary. I suppose \square (machine) makes sense, as does \rightarrow (\Rightarrow must). When talking about something that is a matter of mechanically determined sequential events, \square or \rightarrow make sense. Including both chance \wedge and necessity \rightarrow also makes sense for general use \curvearrowright . Goethe wrote "Das Gewebe dieser Welt ist aus Tucht und Notwendigkeit geworben," -- the fabric of this world is woven from chance and necessity. But human will, of course, transcends these. At least, the necessity involved in human will is not mere mechanical necessity. I am reminded of an essay by Jaques Vallee in a UFO book from the 60s in which he wrote that (animal) life has a strong component of anti-chance: if you drop a cat, it will land on its feet every time, unlike dice.
