


 shelter \wedge roof ∇ shield

This is an etymid. "Shelter" comes from "shield", or they are cognates. I have mixed feelings (⊗) about etymids: on the one hand I'd like to get away from them completely because many of them seem so inaccurate + impediments to clean conceptualization + free futuristic language; on the other hand they are often convenient. ∇ works well enough for "shelter" while evoking and relying on a bit of etymological knowledge

 climb [Latin, scand, scand] \nearrow ascend (\rightarrow to, [-a]) \searrow descend

the hand $-c$ and foot b and upward slanted line combine to convey the meaning of "climb" well, + indeed in a direct, bodily-experience way. It is a simple, trivial id, but effective.
