$\circ \circ$ same Sometimes I use a circle as a general "thing", often to which characteristics are attached
 (\circ characteristic $\circ \rightarrow$ aspect, \circ quality (of a thing)
 I like $\circ \circ$ for "same" it fits the reality it refers to well - it is a good mapping - because of structural similarity - verisimilitude

$\cdot \circ \circ$ Latin dot .idem = same
 $\cdot \circ \circ \cdot$ identical - "ditto mark for emphasis" = adjective indicator
 $\cdot \circ \circ$ I use \cdot hand as an agency indicator

(= -fy: \circ qualify \vec{I} specify)
 $\vec{I} \circ \circ$ adding "I" \circ
 When I identify with something I think that I am the same as it.
 $\vec{I} \circ \circ \circ \# \otimes \circ \Delta \circ \circ \dagger - \circ \circ \# \dots$

To me, adding \vec{I} in this way for this sense strengthens and enriches the concept.
