

### THE CONDITIONED RESPONSE

Pavlov, a famous Russian scientist, suspected that many of our responses to average situations were inappropriate. His experiments in which he conditioned a dog to salivate to a bell proved his point. He caused a hungry dog's saliva to flow by presenting it with meat and at the same time rang a bell. After a number of repetitions, the bell alone caused the dog to salivate. The natural response of salivating to food had been transferred to an artificial one - the bell. Pavlov called this a conditioned response.
